Project Title: Forgotten History of Zagreb - Sites of Memory, Sites of Forgetting

Financed by: The Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA)

The project "Forgotten History of Zagreb - Sites of Memory, Sites of Forgetting" aims to examine the ways in which victims who died in the park of Dotršćina (during WWII) are forgotten today in the city's public memory. The project also intends to initiate a dialogue related to remembrance and commemoration of all victims.

The project consists of a **temporary exhibition** that will explore mass executions in Zagreb in general and at the Dotršćina Park in particular. In addition, during the project implementation, there will be a **workshop organized**, in which will be discussed the ways Dotršćina should be remembered, preserved and turned into a memorial to all victims of fascism. Another activity foreseen with this project is to initiate placing of a **plaque** at the entrance of the Park containing information related to the events that happened there during the WWII and thus provide commemoration to all victims who lost their lives at this site.
